Through our network, we reach more than 60 countries in Africa, Latin America, Asia and Eastern Europe.

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## RECI INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENTS IN 2022

With its 2021-2025 Strategic Plan, RECI has embarked on a journey to increase the active participation of its members in the network.

The thematic orientation of RECI is defined by its members based on their needs, interests, and priorities. Members have different spaces they can fill with topics that they want to work on with others.

In 2022, the two working groups, "Education in Emergencies" and "Teacher Training for Quality Education," continued their work, conducting both groupinternal and public events (see more on p. 13). Preparatory work for establishing a new working group on "Adult Education" started in 2022.

OROS (Online RECI Open Space) are time slots for online events where members are invited to propose relevant and interesting topics.

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In 2022, three OROS were organised (see more on p. 15).

RECI also worked to further strengthen its institutional standing. With the goal of including more organisations and experts, RECI further developed its membership criteria and benefits and reached out to organisations and experts that would enrich the work of RECI. Nine new members joined RECI in 2022.

Grant-giving foundations can now become members. RECI also developed a new membership category for students and set up the concept for a Group of Friends who will support RECI morally and financially.

## "Reframing Eduction for a Sustainable World"

The RECI Thematic Day 2022 was a hybrid conference held on 16 November in Bern and online. The event provided a lively space for mutual learning, participatory exchange and the development of new ideas on the current and future state of teacher education for sustainable development and global citizenship education.

In two plenary sessions and several interactive and open space workshops with contributions from RECL members, IBE-UNESCO, SDC (Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation) and many other partners, a wide range of participants in Switzerland and around the world discussed approaches, practical tools, best practices, challenges and lessons learned for the further development of Education for a Sustainable Euture Worldwide.

Some 70 people took part in Bern at the Paul Klee Centre, and 50 people from more than 20 countries participated online.

The participants enjoyed an inspiring debate with passionate speakers. Afterwards, they divided into different workshops, where they helped to shape and animate the discussions on current topics around Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 4.7 and the interdependence between environment, human rights and education.

In each workshop, the participants formulated recommendations and resolutions concerning SDG 4.7. These recommendations will be taken up by the Teacher Training for Quality Education (TTQE) working group to develop guidelines and practical tools for education policymakers and practitioners.


*To all stakeholders* : better collaborate and build alliance to address structural constraints and enable children and youth to bring sustainable change.



## THEMATIC WORKING GROUPS

In 2022, there were two thematic working groups led by a member of RECI.

They brought together more than ten members each, to conduct ongoing mutual learning and development of practical approaches and tools within the defined theme:



WORKING GROUP "TEACHER TRAINING FOR QUALITY EDUCATION – TTQE"

Individual Members Sybille Ganz-Köchlin; Anne Malaplate; Marion Panizzon; Quality education implies that teachers are well-trained and supported within education systems, but in developing countries or in fragile contexts, too many teachers lack proper training and access to basic resources.

This is where the TTQE working group comes in to discuss and develop approaches and tools to support teacher training.

In 2022, the TTQE working group organised the OROS "Gender-Sensitive Teaching: Insights from African and Latin American Contexts" (see p.15), and the Thematic Day (see pp. 7-10).

## WORKING GROUP "EDUCATION IN EMERGENCIES - EIE"

Access to quality education is a major issue affecting millions of children and young people worldwide. In crisis situations. sustainable education is urgently needed to prevent lost generations and create future prospects. The lack of education creates high risks, such as child labour and violence. In response, the **RECI EiE working group** organises events, discussions, and webinars to address education in crisis situations. The group's activities aim to enhance awareness and knowledge of the issue and to provide practical solutions.

In 2022, the working group held four events. The RECL EiE working group shared advocacy practices and funding mechanisms for education in crisis with the Danish Alliance and discussed collaboration with the EiE Hub in Geneva. They organised a webinar on education response in Ukraine and a hybrid workshop on the triple nexus and education's role in peacebuilding and social cohesion. The events presented programmatic experiences, discussed potential synergies and the importance of coordination, and highlighted the role of education in emergencies.

## **OROS – ONLINE RECI OPEN SPACE**

In 2022, RECI once again set aside several moments throughout the year during which members could propose and organise a webinar, with the support of the back office. Three OROS were conducted:

## Private Sector Engagement in Basic Education and Lifelong Learning



Thibaut Lauwerier from the University of Geneva organised the webinar on 24 February, presenting key points from the UNESCO Global Education Monitoring Report on the topic and facilitating the joint identification of key questions and challenges for further discussions in subgroups. The webinar was for Swiss-based RECI members, held in French, and had 11 participants.

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## Psycho-social Support in Education Projects

This third OROS was organised on June 30 by **Vivamos Mejor** and their partner organisation **Apoyar** in Colombia. They presented their approach to psycho-social support in education projects and invited participants to share and discuss their questions and challenges. The webinar was held in English and Spanish and had 25 participants, of which 18 were from the Global South.

## Gender-Sensitive Teaching: Insights from African and Latin American Contexts

The working group "Teacher Training for Quality Education" prepared this webinar on April 28, which included project presentations from Enfants du Monde, with a project on how to integrate gender issues throughout the curriculum in Chad, from Terre des Hommes with a project on masculinities in Latin America, as well as from Triple T on a project on gender-sensitive education in Tanzania. The webinar was held in English and Spanish and had 29 participants, of which 15 were from the Global South. SIGN UP!

## NETWORKING AND PARTNERSHIPS

In 2022 RECI continued its participation in the Global Campaign for Education (GCE), with contributions to the ENACE (Europe and North America Campaign for Education) constituency. During the Global Action Week for Education (GAWE) in April, we joined the social media campaign to protect education in emergencies.

In November, RECI participated in the GCE World Assembly in Johannesburg. The World Assembly finalised and approved the new GCE Strategy, discussed several GCE policy motions, elected a new board and worked on a number of focus topics. One of the highlights was the discussion on the decolonisation of education financing, a topic that RECI would like to pursue further with its members.

The World Assembly was also an opportunity to network

with national education coalitions from around the world, to contribute to the further formation of the regional coalition ENACE, and to specify how RECI can collaborate within this global movement. As a member of GCE, RECI is committed to contributing to the implementation of the new GCE Strategy over the next five years.

RECI also continued its active membership at the Platform Agenda 2030 and elaborated information on the relation between the international human rights framework and the 2030 Agenda, specifically SDG 4.

The contact with FoBBIZ, the Swiss Forum for Vocational Education and International Cooperation, has been strengthened, with the aim to develop closer collaboration in the coming years.
