

**Workshop Title: What do real participation approaches mean in humanitarian contexts (and more generally)**

**Main issues, questions discussed:**

- Starting discussion on the definition of participation
- What are baby steps to include more participation in programming and projects
- What are some of the challenges?
- Some examples of participatory projects were shared and helped identify steps to promote more participation
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**Conclusions:**

Participatory research is well defined and mainstream, but not necessarily participatory programming.

**Challenges:**

- Dedicated resources, including funding,
- Difference in perspectives and values

**Some first steps to promote participation:**

- Include beneficiary groups (people with disabilities, teachers, girls, etc.) from the beginning in project design. Requirement: avail funding for pre-proposal.
- Give time to participants to reflect on their roles and then to further participate
- Raise donors awareness – Question of identifying evidence about relevant participators approaches
- Allow for adapting proposals over time
